

WHAT IS RECOVERY CAMP?

Established in 2013 **Recovery Camp** is an award-winning, evidence-based program with a focus on mental health recovery, education and research.

Recovery Camp provides:

- a professional development program for health professionals, enhancing their ability to deliver trauma informed, recovery-oriented care
- programs which promote and support the well-being and recovery of people with mental illness
- student education, focused on developing socially aware future health professionals.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

People with mental illness, health students and health professionals spend a week together at a therapeutic recreation camp. Participants are immersed in a structured, recovery oriented program that facilitates individual growth.

Recovery Camp is a collaborative learning experience where students and people living with mental illness contribute in equal measure; learning from and with one another they complete a program of activities that builds connection and challenges negative stereotypes.
